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Hello.

Four eyes are staring at you from the cover of this new Zwiggelaar catalogue.

They are part of Joel Fisher's art series 'Eye of the Dealer' from the late 1970s, sent out as exhibition postcards. The front features the eye of Joel Fisher photographed by gallerist Salvatore Ala, and the eye of Salvatore Ala photographed by the artist Joel Fisher. The rear shows Kiki Maier-Hahn's eye shot by Joel Fisher and Fisher's eye shot by Maier-Hahn.

I hope the auction content protrudes a similar intensity, assembled from great sources, selected with an eye hovering between the dealer and the artist. There's a lot to see!

As always: the catalogue has fluid categories with sections devoted to the 1960s, Fluxus, 1970s, 1980s and up, small press and ephemera. This time there's a new section with groundbreaking group show catalogues. It's a journey starting with New Forms New Media at Martha Jackson Gallery in New York in 1960, to early Siegelaub projects, conceptual art shows in Germany (Paul Maenz, Prospect, Blockade), The Netherlands (Op Losse Schroeven), Austria (When Attitudes become Form, Magna Feminism), Japan (Tokyo Biennale 70), Former Yugoslavia (In Another Moment), Scotland (Strategy Gets Art), Argentina (Art as Idea), ending with seminal performance shows in Belgium and Italy in 1978. Another new section presents reference works and sales catalogues, with some great Steven Leiber catalogues and a rare J.N. Herlin publication form 1983.

Here are some more highlights:

In the 1960s category we're proud to offer the scarce catalogue of Piero Manzoni's first show at Galleria Azimut in 1959, some very early Yves Klein announcements, and Zero related items including rare works by herman de vries.

The Fluxus chapter has a large selection of Wolf Vostell items, a striking original collage by Addi Koepcke, rare ephemera from John Cage and Merce Cunningham, an elaborately designed announcement and publication by La Monte Young and Marian Zazeela, and original collages by Yoshio Nakajima.

The extensive 1970s conceptual art section hosts some amazing original works including a John Baldessari drawing from 1972 (a sketch for Ingres and Other Parables), an original weather drawing by Marinus Boezem (from his installation at 'Op Losse Schroeven' at the Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam 1969), an intriguing box with (deliberately) crumpled drawings by Ira Joel Haber, an original Mario Merz Fibonacci drawing and Zero Cruzeiro bills by Cildo Meireles. It also contains a set of archival material of Sonsbeek 71 from the collection of Wim Beeren, including photos, letters and sketches by Robert Smithson, Ed Ruscha, Claes Oldenburg et al. For a large part this section is a

treasure trove for artists' book lovers, with iconic publications by Seth Siegelaub, stanley brouwn, Bas Jan Ader, Gordon Matta Clark, Ed Ruscha, Lawrence Weiner, Baldessari, Dibbets, stanley brouwn, Bas Jan Ader, Gordon Matta Clark, Marina Abramovic/ Ulay, Valie Export, Simone Forti, On Kawara, Donald Judd, Kristjan Gudmundsson and many others. Among the gems are two publications by Allen Ruppersberg, including the 'A Novel That Writes Itself: A Proposal to Friends and Supporters', 1978. It introduces the project in which one could purchase a role in the novel linked to Ruppersberg's life.

The Small Press category presents an interesting array of artists' assemblings and magazines, from more well known publications such as Aspen, Avalanche and Art-Rite to more obscure zines such as Pro, Prop, Nummer, Grisalda: A Weird Newspaper, and a near complete set of the London based Wall Paper. There are several publications published by Beau Geste Press in Devon UK, including Ulises Carrion's 'Looking for Poetry'

The 1980s and up opens with the first solo exhibition catalogue by Basquiat from 1982, and features items by Keith Haring, Rammellzee, Douglas Gordon, Mike Kelley, Tracey Emin, Marlene Dumas, Rachel Harrison, Richard Long (original drawing), Daniel Buren (t-shirt and multiple), and a collection of 'Just Another Asshole' edited by Barbara Ess. It also contains beautiful intimate works such as two James Lee Byars letters to Rudi Fuchs, and a collaborative photo book by Truus Nienhuis and Jan Schoonhoven.

Ephemera reigns once again. Extra notice is paid to the famous Art & Project bulletins, and documentation of Bruce Nauman works. Among the featured artists are Gerhard Richter (very rare poster for his first solo exhibition and a seascape postcard), stanley brouwn, Bas Jan Ader, Beuys, Chris Burden, COUM/Genesis P Orridge, Hanne Darboven, Panamarenko, Dennis Oppenheim, Marinus Boezem (photo reportage), Muntadas, On Kawara, Mario Merz, Kounellis, Penone et al. Some special art spaces appearing in this section comprise Aktionsraum 1 Munich (huge set of flyers), Gallery House and Art Meeting Place London, and Alberta College of Art in Calgary. Not to be missed are the amusing Miller & Ringma Paparazzi Self-Portraits, including a colour photo with Debbie Harrie in CBGB New York 1977, verso stamped 'Bettie Punks Out!'.

Avant-Garde: 1960s (6000 - 6056)

Denise René, 1955/1975. Manifesto originally issued for the show 'Le Mouvement' at Galerie Denise René, Paris, April 6 - 30, 1955, featuring Agam, Bury, Calder, Duchamp, Jacobsen, Soto, Tinguely and Vasarely. The groundbreaking exhibition was curated by Denise René, Victor Vasarely, Roger Bordier, and Pontus Hulten and marked the beginning of kinetic art. This copy is the facsimile edition released for the show held in 1975 at Denise René Gallery in New York, celebrating the 20th anniversary of the original event in Paris. Bright yellow sheet, printed both sides in black. Unfolded: 49.8 x 32.5 cm, folded: 24.6 x 16.2 cm. Contains the Manifesto by Victor Vasarely titled 'Notes pour un Manifeste/ Le Manifeste Jaune', as well as texts by Hulten and Bordier in French. The 1975 reprint is brighter and printed on thicker paper than the original 1955 edition. In very good state.

Paris, Galerie Colette Allendy, 1956 - Invitation card for 'Yves Propositions Monochromes', Klein's first extensive exhibition of his monochrome paintings (a small presentation was held earlier in Paris in 1955). Folded card, 19.5 x 9.5 cm, printed red and black on thick white paper, 4 pp. Contains an important early text in French by Pierre Restany about the artist, titled 'La Minute de Verité' (The Moment of Truth). Minor soiling spots, generally a fine copy.

Designed by the Polish typographer and artist Corneille Hannoset. Taptoe was a short-lived but influential centre for the arts in Brussels in the 1950s, which set out to revitalize Belgium's avant-garde.



good copy. Azimut was an artist-run space founded by Manzoni and Castellani, located in a basement at Via Clerici 12 in Milan. It was inaugurated on the 4th of December 1959 with Manzoni's solo show Le Linee. This was the first presentation of the -later to become famous- Linee series, drawings of a single line on a length of paper, signed, rolled up and sealed in a cardboard tube. The experimental space only lasted 8 months but presented 13 exhibitions featuring international avant garde artists. Manzoni and Castellani also directed an artists' periodical titled Azimuth, launched in the same year. Added: Piero Manzoni, exhibition poster Galleria Schwarz Milan 1964. Offwhite sheet, 57 x 33 cm, printed both sides, folded twice. Published on the occasion of Manzoni's first posthumous exhibition in February 1964. Recto features the name of the artist and the announcement of the exhibition; verso presents memorial texts from critics, artists and friends of Manzoni, among these Baj, Castellani, Dorfles, Fontana, Schwarz et al. This card is lacking a black sheet which seems to have been glued onto the back, making the white lettering stand out. Incomplete, but extremely scarce item. This issue was dedicated to the then recently deceased Yves Klein and Piero Manzoni. Edited by herman de vries, released in an edition of 300. Stapled booklet, 27.6 x 21.8 cm, 20 pp. text in German, French and English. Cover features Manzoni's enlarged fingerprints with hand stamped red 0. Contributions by Schoonhoven, Aubertin, Haacke, Castellani et al. Includes the original collage with the 'Yves Klein-blue' square on black paper. 6008 Piero Manzoni, Life and Works. Berlin, Verlag Petersen Press, 1969 - Numbered 78/100 and signed in marker by Jes Petersen on the plastic binder, 18 x 15 cm, ca. 60 translucent pp. bound by plastic slide spine. Except for the cover with printed title and publishing information, the mylar sheets are all blank. This is the second edition of 100 copies. The artists' book was conceived by Manzoni just before his death in February 1963, the first edition was published posthumously by Jes Petersen later that year. Petersen appears to be the author of this publication, as his name is listed above the title. This was a Manzoni joke though Petersen did suggest the use of translucent paper. 6009 Daily Bul magazine. La Louvriere, Editions de Montbliart, 1957- 1964 - Seven issues of the Belgian publication Daily-Bul (1957-1983), which defined itself as the 'most disrespectful magazine of the world'. Founded by painter/sculptor Pol Bury (1922-2005) and poet/writer André Balthazar (1934-2014), it featured contributions by the best known artists and writers of the era, including some original collages and drawings. Fourteen issues were published from 1957 to 1983 with texts by a.o. Christian Dotremont and Roland Topor. This set contains No.1 (1957), No.3, No.5, No.6 (1957, contributions by Alechinsky and an inserted booklet by Claudette David), No.7 (1958), No.9 (1963) and No.10 (1964). Contains the special issue Bah! No.7, which has original interventions by Pol Bury using gouache and felt-pen. No.6 shows some edge-wear of the











Paris, Roberto Altmann, 1961-1962 - Beige canvas portfolio with publisher's flaps and cloth closure straps, housing 5 original lithographs and 2 text leaves printed on vellum, 42 x 33 cm. Published in an edition of 50 copies, printed by Rene Guillard, Paris and Emil Matthieu Zurich. Features striking colour lithos by Isidore Isou, Guy Harloff, Gherasim Luca, Joaquim Ferrer and Wifredo Lam. Each print signed and numbered (10/50) by the artist. Issou presents a beautiful Lettrist Composition dated 1961, the colours in Guy Harloff's mandala type piece 'work is the great power' are almost glowing. Portfolio exterior shows considerable wear (see pictures), title sheets browned, tiny pinholes on center top and bottom of the works by Lam and Luca, yet all lithos in very fine condition. € 500 - € 800

Loosely inserted is a pictorial flyer printed on pink tissue paper titled 'Homenagem de KWY'. Added is a large folded poster announcing an exhibition by Lourdes Castro and René Bertholo at Galeria Divulgacao in Lisbon, 1964. The magazine is in fine condition. Rare. (total 2) KWY magazine was founded in Paris in 1958 by the Portuguese artist couple Lourdes Castro and René Bertholo, named after the three letters that do not exist in the Portuguese alphabet. Starting out as a vehicle for the Portuguese avant-garde in exile, it grew to include contributors such as Christo, Pol Bury, Gonçalo Duarte, Escada and Jan Voss. Twelve issues were produced between 1958-1963. The KWY Group was active between 1960-1967, its members were regular contributors to the magazine who often exhibited together.


