Welcome to the ninth catalogue for the Artists' Books, Editions and Ephemera auction! The Sonia Delaunay card deck on the cover sets the stage for a playful and exciting edition featuring works from a number of amazing collections.

We kick off with a selection from the Dada library of Dutch writer, poet and art critic K. Schippers, whose work and life were imbued with a Dada spirit. A noted authority on Duchamp, Dada and Surrealism, Schippers also authored a seminal study on Dada in The Netherlands. The auction presents reference works, tracts and documents, alongside books and artworks ranging from Tzara's papillons, postcards from Kurt Schwitters and Theo van Doesburg, chess compositions by Duchamp, to photographs by Man Ray and Hans Bellmer, and a precious collage by Adya van Rees-Dutilh.

The collection further expands into Zero territory, with early sketches and a rare embossed print series by Schoonhoven, as well as works by Henk Peeters including an original pink and purple powder puff. The wildest find consists of two Top Hats that were used at a 1989 Zero Fest in Dusseldorf, one signed and worn by Schoonhoven, the other signed by Mack, Piene and Uecker.

We're also pleased to present two special collections featuring works by James Lee Byars and Jiri Valoch, assembled by Belgian gallery owner, publisher, collector, curator and author Guy Schraenen. The Byars section includes miniature text pieces, signature letters (some remarkably long), a Cube Book, a black feather and various forms of ephemera. Many of these works were exhibited in Schraenen's 1995 show at the Neues Museum Weserburg Bremen, 1995. Valoch's section features some breathtaking early handmade artists' booklets, including one composed entirely of stamped commas, another one with die-cut shapes.

As always, the catalogue embraces fluid categorisation. One recurring section focuses on women artists, this time with original works by Françoise Janicot and Lourdes Castro, prints by Louise Nevelson, Agnes Martin, Faith Ringgold (Peoples Flaq Show 1970), Suzan Pitt (Asparagus 1974), and stickers by Jenny Holzer.

The Avant Garde section features the famous Nouveaux Realistes Suitcase housing eleven works including Daniel Spoerri's pop-up cardboard table. Exciting artists' publications are highlighted in the categories Conceptual Art, Fluxus, Concrete Poetry, Small Press and Mail Art. Ephemera rules again, with ultra rare Fluxus invitations (Galerie Parnass 1962), an early Panamarenko poster, Dwan gallery announcements, amazing Happening posters by Allan Kaprow and an entertaining tract by André Cadere.

We close by returning to Dada and Surrealism with a hidden gem: a 1968 Alexandre lolas catalogue containing a small handmade collage by Max Ernst, dedicated to his (unidentified) friend Jacques.




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

Also features Huelsenbeck's first Dada speech in Germany and contributions by Citroen, Soupault, Picabia, Mehring, Darmée, Arp, and Hugo Ball. Text in German. Cover shows mild foxing, paper slightly browned and some age spotting in the margins, fine copy. Rare important Dada document. € 300 € 60
- Friesland, verso handwritten letter to 'Rins' and signed 'Does'. Two tiny clean tears caused by embossed postal stamp, not impacting the writing. During their military mobilisation (1914-1916), van Doesburg, founder of De Stijl in 1917, became friends with Evert Rinsema, shoemaker, poet and philosopher from Drachten. An extensive correspondence developed (1915-1931) in which they exchanged ideas about art and society. The text on the postcard refers to a dispute ignited by a newspaper journalist who criticized van Doesburg's use of colour in his design for a housing project in the city of Drachten. - Goo3 Collection of three Papillons Dada, ca. 1919-1920 Three leaflets, printed black on green and brown paper. The texts on the series of broadsides are attributed to Paul Eluard and Tristan Tzara and issued by the Paris Dada group in December 1919. The Papillons were intended for general distribution, introducing an early form of advertisement in the artistic field that would be significant for the Dada movement and the Surrealists. 

Poster for the iconic 'Dada-fieldtrip' held by Theo and Nelly van Doesburg, Kurt Schwitters and Vilmos Huszár throughout The Netherlands in December 1922 and early 1923. Featured is the event program of the tour, in dadaist typography, listing ragtime music by Erik Satie, abstract poetry by Schwitters, and 'Dadasofie' by van Doesburg, intertwined with multilingual slogans, such as 'Dada est contre le futur, Dada est mort, Dada est idiot, vive Dada!'. This copy is the first version for the event at the Haagsche Kunstkring in The Hague, the address and year are shown in the upper right corner. Mounted on black board, 33 x 33 cm, glued with two tips on the upper corners. In the early 1920s the international avant-garde movement was brought to Drachten by the brothers Thijs and Evert Rinsema who befriended the figurehead of De Stijl Theo van Doesburg and Dadaist Kurt Schwitters. They became regular visitors and executed several art and architecture projects in Drachten, some in collaboration with De Boer. Drachten was also the last venue of the (in)famous 'Dada Fieldtrip', held on 13 April 1923. € 700 € 900

headed straight to De Kring, parking in front of the club. Whilst inside,
the car was broken into and the audio tapes and photos were stolen. (2)

It reads 'In grooten dank aan Schippers, voor het goede werk wat hij heeft gedaan. Nelly van Doesburg, Meudon, 20 IV '74.' The note conveys Nelly's sincere appreciation of Schippers' work, with whom she had maintained an ongoing and thoughtful correspondence. Schippers went to Meudon in 1974 to give her the newly printed book, possibly this particular copy was inscribed at that time. (total 2)

Issue No.2 includes the famous photo of Duchamp's Fountain made by Alfred Stieglitz. Other contributors include Mina Loy, Erik Satie, Francis Picabia, Frances Simpson Stevens, Joseph Stella et al. Produced as an artists' project by Crowner and the design and publishing collaborative Dexter Sinister for the Whitney Biennial 2008, in an unknown edition size. The copies were offered for sale at original cover prices (10 cents and 15 cents) via the front desks of the Whitney Museum and the Armory on 14 March 2008. They were also included in a travelling show 'For the blind man in the dark room looking for the black cat that isn't there' organized by the Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis held in 2009-2010. € 80 - € 150






Hardcover, wallpaper type wrapper with mounted title label on spine, 21 x 14.5 cm, 426 pp. Published in August 1923. Rubbing to spine and corners, light corner bumps, usual age toning on paper edges, with some staining in the interior, generally a fine copy. Extremely rare. Henrie Waste was the pseudonym for Ettie Stettheimer (1875–1955). She and her sisters, Carrie and Florine, were known socialites amongst the artistic and intellectual community in New York, hosting an influential salon at their home. They befriended Marcel Duchamp, who features as a character in the novel named Pierre Delaire, a French cubist painter. Other recognizable artworld appearances include Maxim Gorky and the Delaunays. The protagonist Susanna Moore is based on Ettie herself. Love Days is considered a feminist novel, asserting that romantic



- love is not compatible with a woman's self-realization. Referenced in Francis M. Naumann, New-York Dada 1915-1923. € 300 € 500

Covers and spine lightly toned and partly stained, small tears along spine, moderate dog-eared corners, regular toning around paper edges. Memoirs of Kiki de Monteparnasse (Alice Prin) in the original French edition of 1929. As an artist, muse and model for Man Ray, Foujita, Moïse, Kisling and others, she was the embodiment of the Parisian culture of the 1920s.
