Conditions of Sale

- 2. Each buyer is held to buy for his own account and cannot claim any commission.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the buyer. Floor and written bids always take precedence over absentee bids left at Invaluable.com. The auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to settle any dispute. The auctioneer reserves the right to divide or to unite lots and to refuse any bid. In case of error or dispute with respect to bidding, the auctioneer is entitled to re-open the bidding. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sale records are always conclusive.
- 4. Artworks by living artists and artists who died no longer than 70 years ago that are sold with a hammer price of 2500 euros or higher, will be charged with an extra 4% ('droit de suite', 'wet Volgrecht', 'resale right Law') over the total amount of hammerprice and buyer's premium.
- 5. The goods are in good condition, unless otherwise stated. If any named item in this catalogue proves defective, the item may be returned, provided this is done within one week after the sale. This guarantee does not cover lots indicated as 'w.a.f.' In addition, the following conditions apply to the art, graphics and poster departments:
 - All objects in the auction are described in good conscience. However, descriptions, as well as verbal statements made before or during the auction, do not represent more than an opinion, and do not in any way constitute a guarantee of authenticity, date, origin, etc.
 - Barring notable exceptions, the condition of the lots is not mentioned in the catalogue. Mention of any defect does not imply the absence of others. Each object is sold in the condition it is in at the time of auction. Prospective buyers must verify the condition themselves during the viewing days (additional photos can be supplied).

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Introduction

Welcome to the new auction, once again filled with treasures. The catalogue opens with a large selection of Situationist items from the collection of Mazdak Wahedi. As an architecture student in Paris in the 70s, he became fascinated by the Situationists and started assembling publications and documents exploring the Paris-based group and their international off-shoots. Over the years this accumulated into an extensive library.

Founded in July 1957, the Situationist International brought together currents of experimental poetry, avant-garde art, and radical social criticism to explore new techniques of engagement in cultural protest and revolutionary praxis. It was influential in the transnational uprisings of 1968, and even after it disbanded in 1972 their impact continues to be felt today.

Presented in the auction are tracts, posters, pamphlets and books ranging from the 'classic' Internationale Situationniste periodicals, writings by Guy Debord (in various languages), the early Scandinavian scene around Jørgen Nash, Asger Jorn and the SPUR group, to Situationist inspired poetry, film and architectural publications. There are various lots on the Mai 68 Paris student upheaval and further Situ-infused social political movements from France, Italy, the USA/Bay Area et al. A rare booklet on Caribbean Situationists presents a gorgeous example of the movement's wide reach. One of the key items in Wahedi's collection is Guy Debord's 'Le Jeu de la Guerre' (Game of War). This board game, designed in 1977, now seems eerily of the moment.

A fresh highlight in this auction comprises the section on women artists, celebrating powerful works from the 1970s into the 1990s. Featured are Beatriz Gonzalez, Sister Corita, Agnes Martin, Jenny Holzer, Barbara Kruger, Hanne Darboven, Hetty Huisman, Barbara Bloom, Rineke Dijkstra and many others. Several Carolee Schneemann works are offered, including ABC- We Print Anything- In The Cards. Also included is the Artforum issue with the famous 1974 Paula Cooper Gallery advertisement featuring a photo of Benglis in the nude, striking a fierce pose with a huge dildo. The provocative ad is hard to find, often it was removed or defaced for its explicit sexual content.

In line with the previous auctions, a Fluxus section is hosted - this time with a special focus on Ben Vautier. Both issues of Fourre Tout are offered, as well as an impressive collection of documents sent by Vautier to François De Dio, founder of the legendary publishing house Editions Soleil Noir in Paris. Included are letters, announcements, text scores, small magazines and some original collages from the late 1960s. One work consists of a mounted nail accompanied by the text 'Plant this nail in a wall so as to be able to hang a painting on it; but don't hang anything.' Other artists featured are Takako Saito, Ken Friedman, Eric Anderson, Yoko Ono, Brecht, Nam June Paik et al.





The 1960s and 70s are well represented by iconic artists such as Gordon Matta Clark (Walls paper, 1973 and Splitting, 1974), André, Ghirri, Toroni, Broodthaers er al. Noteworthy is the James Lee Byars multiple '5 Continent Documenta 7', a black paper fold out piece intended as a protest against Documenta 7's Western-centric perspective.

The 1980s are sizzling with the East Village, Basquiat, Warhol, Haring, Seen and General Idea. Included is Basquiat's 1984 Fruitmarket Gallery catalogue, paired with an invitation card. The European 80s are covered by Figuration Libre, Mulheimer Freiheit, Rainer, Cucchi, Rene Daniëls et al. Added is a rare special edition of Georg Herold's artists' book 'I'm not coming to dinner' (1984) which has an actual copper doorknob mounted to its cover.

Concrete poetry giants such as Dom Sylvester Houedard, Vigo, Clemente Padin, Paul de Vree, Henri Chopin, Herman Damen, Castillejo, John Furnival and Ian Hamilton Finlay are presented in the Small Press and Concrete Poetry section. Other featured artists comprise Julien Blaine, Claude Pelieu, Albrecht D. and zines such as Spanner, Plages, Noise, MW, Ohio, Purple and Permanent Food.

The poster and the ephemera part is chock-full of striking items. It includes a set of 209 announcement sheets from De Appel (1975-1981) and invites from legendary galleries such as Wide White Space (Antwerp), Videogalerie Schum and Konrad Fischer (Dusseldorf), Nancy Gillespie and Durand-Dessert (Paris), Helen van der Meij and Stempelplaats (Amsterdam), Monica Sprüth and Michael Werner (Cologne) and Lucy Milton (London). Special lots from New York in the 80s include Studio 54, The East Village, compilations of New York art spaces, and two rare Metro Picture cards featuring Jack Goldstein and Mike Kelley.

Last but not least there's a subculture section featuring Provo material, Anti Vietnam War posters and a thrilling Dutch Techno archive (1991-2001). The vast collection encompasses circa 12000 flyers and cards celebrating the techno, gabber, house, trance, hardcore, terror, old- & new skool, r&b and garage club scene.
