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Dear auction friends,

This is the fourth catalogue in the series of artists' books and ephemera that started with the now famous Deelstra collection in June 2021. Some amazing private collections are steadily finding their way to Zwiggelaar Auctions. It has been an honour to work with the collectors and live with their -often long cherished- treasures for a while. Researching the incoming items and placing them into some kind of curated scheme is a very gratifying process.

The auction is again divided in fluid sections, moving from the avant-garde 1960s to Fluxus, the conceptual 1970s, on to the 1980s and up. There's an extra-large section on Mail Art this time, with many works deriving from the collection of Dutch printer and graphic designer Bart Boumans. Introduced to the international Mail Art network by his friend Ulises Carrion, he became an active participant, culminating in publishing the magazine Care in 1982. Bouman's collection encompasses contributions by Anna Banana, Bill Gaglione, Ulises Carrion, Ruth Wolf-Rehfeldt, Guy Schraenen, Robin Crozier et al.

One of the highlights in the Avantgarde section is the ultra-rare (i.e. not found anywhere else) Manzoni poster for his 1961 show at Koepcke Galerie in Copenhagen. Featuring a beautiful lay-out of seven text lines, it is an artwork in itself. Yves Klein is well represented with his well-known but always striking 'Monochrome und Feuer' triptych from 1961, the 'Dimanche' newspaper and a rare invitation card. Another highlight is an unknown Stanley Brouwn booklet 'Potential starting points', and a unique bright pink lemonspot print (1963). Additional rare items include an announcement poster for an early Bas Jan Ader show in California, and a great photo diptych by Ger van Elk, featuring sardines in an earthquake-crack on a Californian highway. Sticking to roads and California: Ed Ruscha's artists' book 'Royal Road Test' is included as well as 'Every building on the Sunset Strip' and 'Dutch Details'.





There are too many great artists' books, small press and concrete poetry publications to list here. Among the usual suspects are works by Marcel Broodthaers, Dieter Roth, Soll Lewitt, Ian Hamilton Finlay and Jiri Valoch. A great discovery is the handmade book 'Audience distant relative' from 1977 by the Korean/American artist Theresa Hak Kyung Cha (1951-1982). Her work has gained renewed attention, and was, a.o., featured at the Whitney Biennial 2022. Also in this categorie are artists' books by Vera Chaves Barcellos from Brazil, Jolanta Marcolla from Poland, Geza Perneczky from Hungary and Jan Voss, the dynamic artist and artists' book promotor from Amsterdam.

The ephemera section is strong again, with a complete poster set of Daniel Buren's 'Travail in Situ' at Wide White Space, Lucy Lippard card catalogues, extensive assortments of invitation cards by Carl André, a Rauschenberg invite printed on a handkerchief, a Judd poster from Castelli, a collection of cards and letters by Nam June Paik including original drawings, CAYC flyers from Buenos Aires and announcements by various Polish art spaces such as Permafo and Foksal. Just to name a few...

Without further ado I would say: dive in.

Dog-eared at lower right corner with tiny chipped off part (5 mm), staples start to rust, else in very good condition.

- 6001 ARK No.24, original Lucio Fontana cover with hand-made punctured holes- London, Royal College of Art, 1958. 27 x 21.5 cm, 48 pp. Original wrapper, fluorescent orange version (the other being fluorescent green) featuring a printed drawing and added cuts made with a sharp object by Fontana (1899 1968). First sheet contains a stamp by Dutch Zero artist Henk Peeters, who also seems to have written 'ARK/ Fontana' on the spine. Slight scuffing along spine and some minor irregularities on cover. Some of the glue-bound pages in the center part are starting to get loose. ARK (1950-1973) was an academic journal of the Royal College of Art published by students, usually displaying work by graduates. This issue includes a text about Fontana's 'Technical Manifesto' (1947) with some light corrective pencil marks presumably by Peeters. Scarce copy. € 300 € 600
- 6002 Piero Manzoni, Akromatiker Linier Luftplastiker at Galerie Köpcke Copenhagen, 1960- Announcement poster, 64.5 x 25 cm, in white wooden frame with glass, 71 x 31.5 cm. Striking graphic design repeating 7 lines stating 'galerie koepcke lille kirkestraede 1 copenhagen aben 10-30 juni piero manzoni akromatiker linier luftplastiker'. Black text offset printed on off-white paper, with folds as issued, tiny pin holes on upper corner. Printed by Christensens Bogtrykkeri in Herning Denmark, famous for its artists' collaborations. Scarce document, no other copy found. Provenance from the collection of Jes Petersen, director of Galerie Carette in Glücksburg-Ostsee, Manzoni's friend and publisher of the artists' book 'Piero Manzoni. Life and Works'. A known invitation card for the same exhibition reveals that Manzoni expanded the show's content

beyond the works mentioned on the poster. It included white monochromatic paintings (Achrome), lines sealed in cylindrical containers (Linea), inflatable sculptures (Corpi d'Aria) and hardboiled eggs with his fingerprints (Uova scultura) which were shown for the first time. Italian artist Piero Manzoni (1933-'63) is one of the most prominent exponents of the conceptual art of the 1960s. \in 1500 - \in 3000

van Schagen et al. Stanley Brouwn contributed a poem to PTL No.1 (Berekening/Calculation) and an original pasted in autumn leaf to PTL No.2 (Herfstbrouwn). There are several original paperworks/collages by Herman de Vries throughout the series. Beautiful rare set of the first series. (1) No.1 Summer 1963, cover with original stamped red dots, numbered 000047, stamped twice on cover. Creasing along extremities, cover toned along spine, interior near mint. 

Poster, 50.5 x 43 cm, printed black on thin bright yellow paper, folded three times. (2) Mary Sue Anderson, student at Otis Art Institute, Sculptures. Robin Metze Gallery Pasadena reception Sept. 14 1963. Poster printed black on thin bright green paper, folded twice. 50.5 x 35 cm. Both prints together in frame, 86.5 x 56 cm. (3) Silkscreened envelope, 23 x 30.5 cm, for the above posters, 'come to Robin Metze Gallery Pasadena September 14, 1963.' Born in Holland in 1942, Ader settled in Los Angeles in 1963. 6014 Stanley Brouwn, contributions to Spiraal and Tongoni, 1957-1959- In 1957 Stanley Brouwn moved to Amsterdam from Paramaribo (Surinam), aged 22. The same year his first ever published work appeared in Spiraal No.1 (Harry Ruhé, Stanley Brouwn: A Chronology). Brouwn contributed several poems and drawings

to the first fives issues of the Amsterdam based literary and graphic periodical. Included in this lot are issues 1, 2, 3 and 5. Comprises: (1) Spiraal 1, December 57, with poem by SB. Slight damage to top right corner, else very good. (2) Spiraal 2, slight dog ear top right. (3) Spiraal 3, minimal toning on cover. (4) Spiraal 5, reproduced Brouwn drawing on the front cover, two poems and a b/w picture featuring SB on interior of the backcover. All issues staple-bound stencilled booklets, with minimal toning on covers. (5) Tongoni 2 October 1959. With reproduced drawing by Brouwn. Produced by the artist for the portfolio 'Figur 1' by Galerie Patio in Frankfurt in a limited edition of 100 of which 30 were handsigned artists' proofs. This is one of the 30 signed copies, signed in pen in lower right corner. In mint state. Lemonspot can be considered as integral part of Brouwn's work similar to productions like the footstep imprints of pedestrians from the same period, the early 60s. Rare, one copy in Kröller Muller Museum Otterlo The Netherlands. € 3000 - € 5000

6016 Stanley Brouwn, Potentiële beginpunten (Potential starting points), undated ca. 1969- White envelope, 15 x 23 cm, with green stamp 'potentiële beginpunten THIS WAY BROUWN'. Includes a Dutch tv guide (Tros Kompas) from 3-10 May 1969, 19 x 13 cm, with an inserted Brouwn text between pages 84 and 85. Added are 4 sheets of white paper, 17 x 10.5 cm (2 loose, one folded). The sheets are blank except for the third sheet which features a stamp identical to the one on the envelope.

The insert is marked with a green paper circle (possibly as issued, but could have been added by the former owner as a note). Slight creases on edges of envelope, minimal wear on cover of Tros Kompas, Brouwn insert is mint. This work is super rare, not found anywhere. It derives from the collection of Art & Project. The Moma collection holds a collage with the same title from 1969, and a Brouwn contribution in PRO 14 seems to be from the same series titled 'potentiele ausgangspunte'. € 500 - € 1000
